Beginning Farmer Program Administrative Notes

FY 2009 – 2010 July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2010

The Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act was enacted into law in August of 1999. The act was created out of a concern of the aging population of Nebraska's farmers and ranchers and who would be their successors. The Act provides a Nebraska income tax credit to the landlord who rents to an eligible beginning farmer or rancher. This program has become a good tool for the beginning farmer to use while trying to gain access to agricultural assets.

The Beginning Farmer Program has grown these past two years and now has enrolled a total of 185 Nebraska beginning farmers and ranchers and 229 land and other asset owners. Over half of them were enrolled in fiscal years 2008-2009 and 2009-2010. The 2009 changes to the Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act have made an impact on the program and on Nebraska agriculture. Also, 142 beginning farmers and ranchers applied for the personal property tax exemption in 2009 and 2010.

Participants of the program have expressed their "thanks" for the Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act Program at various agriculture shows we have attended. They were sincere in their statements of appreciation and most of the beginning farmers felt they wouldn't have been able to rent the land if it weren't for this program. Several beginning farmers and ranchers also explained their family transition plans and how they would become the owners in the future.

The Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act has been the incentive for many families to discuss the various options that are available to them for transitioning their farm or ranch business to the next generation. Attending transition and succession training is a requirement of the Act. Legal Aid of Nebraska, supported by Nebraska's Farm Mediation Program, provides transition and succession workshops free of charge. Getting families to think about available options for transitioning their business is very valuable, actually developing a plan adds comfort and assurance to all family members. Each operation and family is different and will require very specific plans that will work for their specific situation.

The Board of Directors invited representatives of the Nebraska Agricultural Legislative Committee and their aides to the February board meeting. They were not able to attend due to legislative sessions and hearings, but sent word that they want to attend in the future. The Board welcomes their participation and involvement in the program as well as participation from other farm agencies and organizations. Bringing together the many aspects of agriculture will produce a stronger program to keep producers on the farms and ranches of Nebraska.




