

#### Beginning Farmer Program Administrative Notes

FY 2011 - 2012 July 1, 2011 - June 30, 2012

The Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act was enacted into law in August of 1999. The Act was created out of a concern of the aging population of Nebraska's farmers and ranchers and who would be their successors. The Act provides a Nebraska income tax credit to the landlord who rents to an eligible beginning farmer or rancher. This program has become a good tool for the beginning farmer to use while trying to gain access to agricultural assets. Other benefits for the beginning farmer are a Personal Property Tax Exemption on farm equipment and machinery and reimbursement of an approved finance management course.

Due to a change in the Act in 2008, beginning farmers and ranchers leasing from family members may apply for the tax credit to the landlord. Certification requires the landlord and/or tenant attend a succession workshop and attest that a succession plan exists to provide for the transfer of the asset to the tenant. Transition and succession workshops, offered free of charge by Legal Aid of Nebraska and supported by Nebraska's Farm Mediation Program, meet the succession workshop requirement of the Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act. Approximately 50 families have participated in the program since this change went into effect.

The Beginning Farmer Board is charged with reviewing applications for approval and certification for program benefits. Members of the Board are appointed by the Governor and approved by the Legislature. Six of the seven current board members have been serving together since 2007. Their experience, expertise and familiarity with the program make for an efficient and effective Board dedicated to serving and preserving Nebraska agriculture.

Members of the Nebraska Agriculture Legislative Committee are invited to board meetings. Senator Burke Harr of District 21 and Rick Leonard, Research Analyst for the Agriculture Legislative Committee attended a board meeting.

Other notes of interest regarding the program for this fiscal year were:

- The net worth threshold for applicants was raised from \$175,000 to \$200,000.
- Twenty-two new beginning farmers/ranchers were approved.
- News articles about the program appeared in the Lincoln Journal Star, Fence Post and Reuters News.
- We participated in two workshops provided to veterans interested in farming and ranching.

The below letter of appreciation was received from a beginning farmer participating in the Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act Program.

"I would like to share with you my experience as a new farmer and my appreciation for the Beginning Farmer Program. It is often difficult to catch the attention of potential landlords as a new, small operation. The established, large operations have a significant advantage that allows them to offer a landlord higher rent than a beginning farmer could offer. Nebraska's Beginning Farmer Program provides a powerful incentive to encourage landlords to work with new farmers. For me, the program aided in growing to a size of operation that likely makes a long-term farming career feasible. Of the many challenges I face, I believe that farm operations will continue to grow in size and shrink in numbers, but the Beginning Farmer Program has helped to give me a start and foothold in the industry.

I believe that new farmers are a crucial part of the community and have much to offer the industry and the environment. I am very appreciative of the landlords and the supporters of this program who recognize the value of new farmers."



## Number of Owners Receiving Tax Credits by County **Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Program**


