Returning to the Farm

A program for students, beginning farmers, and established operations

Bringing a young person into a farm/ranch operation presents challenges. However, the business operation *can* accomplish numerous goals by helping the young person get a solid start in the operation, keeping the farm/ranch in the family, and ensuring a comfortable retirement for all involved.

However, success does not come automatically; it requires effort. Blending a variety of talents and personalities into one farming or ranching operation takes planning, communication, and management.

The Returning to the Farm program is designed to assist families and operations in developing a financial plan and successful working arrangements that will meet the needs of multiple families. During the program participants will:

- * Review financial feasibility, balance sheets and trend sheets
- * Identify estate planning issues
- * Develop a farm/ranch transition plan
- * Set both personal and professional goals
- * Look at the communication process between family members
